MEASURING CHART *Please record your measurement on dotted line*

1. HEIGHT

From the top of the head to the floor (without shoes) is the height. A person's height usually determines whether he will need a short, regular or long fitting.

Height Range

5'1" - 5'4"

5'4¹/₄" - 5'7¹/₄"

5'7¹/₂" - 5'10¹/₂"

5'10³/₄" - 6'1³/₄"

6'2" - 6'5"

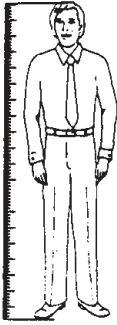

2. WEIGHT

Most people know their weight. It gives a good guide as to general build. Helps create visual picture of person.

3. CHEST

This measurement usually determines the coat size. The measurement is taken with the coat off, around the body.

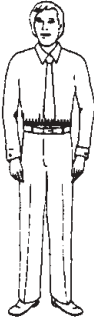
Place the tape well up under the arms, straight across the back, over the shoulder blades and over the chest in the front. Insert a finger between the tape and the body to ensure proper ease and record the measurement.



4. WAIST

Determines pant waist. Place the tape around the body just above the hip bones. Insert a finger between the tape and body and allow freedom to fit. Best to ask how the customer if he likes his pants tight or loose and fit accordingly. NOTE: All pants have adjustable waist bands which allow to comfort adjustment. As an average guide, adding 5 inches to waist gives you jacket size.

EXAMPLE waist 33 jacket 38
waist 35 jacket 40
waist 37 jacket 42



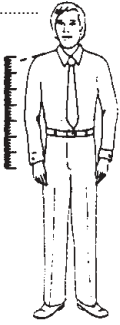
5. SEAT

This measurement is taken with the coat off, around the body. Place the tape measure directly over the pants around the largest part of the seat. Before taking this measurement, see that the customer removes all bulky articles from pockets and has heels together.



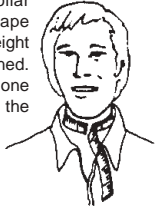
6. SLEEVE LENGTH

The sleeve length, along with a person's height, will determine whether a short, regular or long fitting is required. This measurement is taken with the coat off, and the arms are straight down at the sides. Imagine a line running across the top of the shoulder. To allow for the thickness of the shoulder pad, measure from 1/2" above this line straight down to a point 3/4" below the wrist bone. This is the sleeve length.



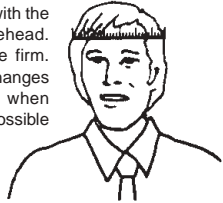
7. NECK

Measure the shirt collar unbuttoned. Place the tape around the neck at the height the collar would fall if buttoned. Take the measurement with one finger between the tape and the neck to ensure proper ease.



8. HAT SIZE

Determines the hat size. Place the tape around the head about 1 inch above the ear in line with with the centre of the forehead. The tape should be firm. Please allow for changes in hair styles when ordering to avoid possible oversizing.



9. LEG LENGTH

Outside leg measurement is gained by asking the customer to stand with his feet together and his trousers up on his waist (the waist centres on the navel). Measure from the top of the waist to the floor and subtract 1 1/2".
